Scripture Alone - 2 Timothy 3:14-17 (ESV)

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions

1. What does it mean to say that Scripture is not the only source of truth, but the final source? Why does this matter?
2. What is the difference between “the Church determined the canon of Scripture” vs “the Church affirmed the self-authenticity of the canon of Scripture”? Why does this matter?
3. A criticism that many use against “Scripture Alone” is the chaos and division that occurs when different interpretations claim to be true. Why is it important to acknowledge this problem? How do we respond to it?
4. Scripture gives us sufficient knowledge but not complete (exhaustive) knowledge. How does this underscore our own humility as we bring our questions to Scripture for answers? How does this fuel our confidence?
5. What is meant by “learning to live with fuzzy edges”? Where have you seen a quest for absolute certainty go awry in the world around us?
6. How does Jesus being the “Word made flesh” restore our confidence and encourage our evangelism?

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
