Advent: A Prophetic Purpose
Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D.
Return to Me – Zechariah 1:1-6 (ESV)

¹ In the eighth month, in the second year of Darius, the word of the LORD came to the prophet Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, son of Iddo, saying, ² "The LORD was very angry with your fathers. ³ Therefore say to them, Thus declares the LORD of hosts: Return to me, says the LORD of hosts, and I will return to you, says the LORD of hosts. ⁴ Do not be like your fathers, to whom the former prophets cried out, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts, Return from your evil ways and from your evil deeds.' But they did not hear or pay attention to me, declares the LORD. ⁵ Your fathers, where are they? And the prophets, do they live forever? ⁶ But my words and my statutes, which I commanded my servants the prophets, did they not overtake your fathers? So they repented and said, As the LORD of hosts purposed to deal with us for our ways and deeds, so has he dealt with us."

Sermon Questions

1. What is significant about Zechariah's message to the people after they have returned from exile? Do you think that "sins as usual" would be discouraging for them?
2. Consider: "First, repentance for Zechariah is not foremost a call to change in conduct, but an invitation to positive relationship with the Lord."—OT scholar Mark Boda. Why is this so important to get right when we consider our own repentance?
3. Consider: "Repentance is not just a matter between individuals and God but also between communities and God...The response of the people encourages the church today to provide opportunity for repentance and confession for the community as a whole."—Mark Boda. In a very individualistic age, what makes this challenging? Why is it so important to get right?
4. "Consider: "Despite what most therapists will tell you, you don't have to resolve your major conflicts for your marriage to thrive"—John Gottman. Gottman makes this claim because reconciliation is first and foremost about relational repair and not problem solving. Returning to the Lord is a return to a covenantal relationship. How does this inform our relationships with others that may be broken?
5. How is this call to return to the Lord an encouragement to you right now? What are some challenges that the gospel will need to be applied to?

**God
Consecrates Us**
Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

**God Communes
with Us**

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
