Do I Have Right to Be Angry? – Jonah 4:1-11 (ESV)

¹ But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. ² And he prayed to the LORD and said, "O LORD, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster. ³ Therefore now, O LORD, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live." ⁴ And the LORD said, "Do you do well to be angry?"

⁵ Jonah went out of the city and sat to the east of the city and made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, till he should see what would become of the city. ⁶ Now the LORD God appointed a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it might be a shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort. So Jonah was exceedingly glad because of the plant. ⁷ But when dawn came up the next day, God appointed a worm that attacked the plant, so that it withered. ⁸ When the sun rose, God appointed a scorching east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint. And he asked that he might die and said, "It is better for me to die than to live." ⁹ But God said to Jonah, "Do you do well to be angry for the plant?" And he said, "Yes, I do well to be angry, angry enough to die." ¹⁰ And the LORD said, "You pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and perished in a night. ¹¹ And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?"

II. A Patient God

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions

1. Verse 1 expresses Jonah's dissatisfaction about as strongly as possible short of profanity. We are intended to be shocked by Jonah's response toward God. How do you account for someone behaving like this? How does the gospel address a heart like Jonah?
2. Verse 2 is almost verbatim to Joel 2:13. We also see this in Exodus 34:6-7, Nehemiah 9:17 and Psalm 145:8. How could God's compassion be the root of someone's anger?
3. The book of Jonah makes us ask the question: "Why should we expect God to have mercy on us and not on others?" How are we to answer that?
4. Some have thought Jonah is upset not at God's mercy, but that God's mercy makes him seem like a false prophet—his words did not come true (Deut. 18:21-22). Either way, there is a profound selfishness in Jonah's heart. How does God try to gently show this to Jonah with the plant?
5. Why should we be good if God is going to forgive wicked people anyways? (Malachi 3:14-15).
6. The book ends giving the reader a choice to either follow Jonah to his ridiculous and even embarrassing hatred or to see the world through God's eyes. How have you seen your own hard heartedness take you to ridiculous conclusions?

**The Lord's
Supper**
The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
