¹¹ And he said, "There was a man who had two sons. ¹² And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them ...

Sermon Questions

1. While we must be careful not to over-psychologize a parable, there are many things that we can draw clear inferences from. Jesus tells this story because it is a picture of how the religious leaders and many of the other Jews viewed Jesus. How is it possible they viewed Jesus as an evil man, in league with the Devil and a blasphemer? What prevents them from rejoicing in the good Jesus is doing?
2. What does the older brother have to tell himself about his father in order to justify his actions? What does he have to tell himself about his younger brother to justify his actions? Is there a kernel of truth in these inner narratives that gets twisted?
3. How would you help someone who has truly been on the receiving end of abuse to change their inner dialogue about themselves? How does the gospel give us a new identity? How do you persevere with someone who struggles to receive this? (1 Thes 5:14-15)
4. Consider: "Realize it or not, you live your life according to some narrative, some story you've constructed about the world and your life. You don't necessarily choose the one that's true, just the one you like." —Pastor Jeff Hamling. Where have you done this in your own life?
5. Consider: "One of the main factors that hides or owns self-centeredness from us is our own history of mistreatment ...When you begin to talk to wounded people, it is not long before they begin talking about themselves. They are so engrossed in their own pain and problems that they don't realize what they look like to others. They are not sensitive to the needs of others. They don't pick up the cues of those who are hurting, or if they do, they only do so in a self-involved way." [Tim Keller, *The Meaning of Marriage*] In what way have you allowed your own self-centeredness to keep you from walking in the newness of life Jesus brings us?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
