## COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: *Psalm 34:9-12*

Oh, fear the LORD, you his saints, for those who fear him have no lack! The young lions suffer want and hunger; but those who seek the LORD lack no good thing. Come, O children, listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the LORD. What man is there who desires life and loves many days, that he may see good?

**All:** Most merciful God whose Son, Jesus Christ, was tempted in every way, yet was without sin, we confess before you our own sinfulness; we have hungered after that which does not satisfy; we have compromised with evil; we have doubted your power to protect us. Forgive our lack of faith; have mercy on our weakness. Restore in us such trust and love that we may walk in your ways and delight in doing your will. This we ask for Jesus' sake. Amen.

**Sermon Questions**

1. What are areas in your life that you struggle with “trusting in the Lord”? Are you even aware of when you are simply “leaning on your own understanding”?
2. Charles Bridges remarks “it is our clear duty not to neglect our understanding but to cultivate it diligently.” In light of this how important is regular time in personal Scriptural devotions and Scripture memory?
3. In some sense, the four sets in vv: 1-8 all say the same thing: listen to the Lord and not to yourself. Why the repeat? At another level, there are differences; how can those differences bless us?
4. All six pairs in this section end with a “positive result” of obedience, what does this tell us about God?

**Children's Question**

*Why might “trusting in the Lord” be harder than “leaning on your own understanding”?  
What's one way you might be able to practice “trusting in the Lord” this week?*

**\*HOW DEEP THE FATHER’S LOVE FOR US**

How deep the Father's love for us, how vast beyond all measure.  
That he should give his only Son to make a wretch his treasure.  
How great the pain of searing loss; the Father turns his face away;  
as wounds which mar the Chosen One bring many sons to glory.

Behold the man upon the cross, my sin upon his shoulders.  
Ashamed, I hear my mocking voice call out among the scoffers.  
It was my sin that held him there until it was accomplished.  
His dying breath has brought me life; I know that it is finished.

I will not boast in anything, no gifts, no power, no wisdom.  
But I will boast in Jesus Christ, his death and resurrection.

*Why should I gain from his reward? I cannot give an answer.  
But this I know with all my heart, his wounds have paid my ransom.*
